Austin Blythe wants to earn college credentials and get to work quickly with no debt. That's why he's enrolled in Maysville Community and Technical College's KY FAME program working toward an Advanced Manufacturing Technician degree.

The KY FAME program allows students to work three days a week and attend college two days a week. He works at the Walker Company in Mt. Sterling Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and attends college Tuesday and Thursday.

"Most college students have to work minimum wage jobs while they are in school. I'm working for a great company making great pay where I'm blowing up rock quarries one day, testing asphalt the next, and also working in the office," he said.

Austin is a first-generation college student, which he said is very important to his family. Recently the company his father works for went through a massive layoff, so they see the value in Austin earning a degree.

"I don't know what my plans for the future are because there is such a wide array of options that I can go to" he said. "I could join the company that I'm at now, which I would love to do, or I could go on to college. MCTC has given that solid foundation. I have so many options."
